*ProBios tube - Equine formula (enteritis issues-diarrhea or ABX admin

GIVE ANY TIME YOU GIVE ABX)

- *Liquid Imodium (for diarrhea-HELPS STOP 1-2 CC'S depending on weight)
- *GasX strips or simethicone drops (gas issues with enteritis BLOAT 1-2 DROPPERS FULL)

Ivermectin or Ivomec –injectable type 1% .5cc for 10# rabbit administer topically)

- *Tums-fruit flavored (calcium boost for kindling does-helps with labor(3-4-crush and give with water via syringe or eye dropper if needed; GIVE 1-2 EVERY DAY FOR 3-4 DAYS AFTER KINDLING)
- *Injectable Penicillin never straight penicillin: I use PenG w/Procaine (mastitis) for dosing see www.medirabbit.com
- *Triple antibiotic ointment, no pain meds in it (general wounds)

Papaya Enzyme – Molting – helps avoid fur block

- *Vetricyn for all wounds, eye issues, everything topical
- *Terramycin eye ointment or Veterycin spray (nestbox eye)

Anti-fungal cream – for fungal infection (usually hocks)

- *Disposable Scalpels-- rounded and pointed blades (lancing abcesses)
- *Vet wrap, sterile gauze pads, telfa pads or band-aides (FOR YOU!),
- *Syringes- feeding type, tuberculin (1cc) and larger, 6-12 CC sizes
- *Hypodermic needles..18g to draw with, 22g to inject with
- *Blue kote, Bag Balm (for wounds, ie. sore hocks, etc.)
- *Spray Iodine, different dilutions (general cleaning, wound care)
- *Vinegar and rubbing alcohol (general cleaning); Bleach & Ammonia
- *Hay when off feed or diarrhea; or molting
- *Oats when off feed

Flour or corn starch – to stop bleeding when clipping nails (oops)

- *Scissors (we have bandage scissors, and small, straight scissors)
- *Tweezers- sharp and blunt

KEVLAR GLOVES-SAVE YOURSELF

Eye Droppers – for administering liquids or meds

- *Scale (charting weight); *Calculator (for calculating dosages for ABX)
- *Dosage charts (for your commonly used meds)
